Rutherford Place Announces Architects For Exquisite Lobby Renovation



Andres Escobar & Associates has been selected to re-design the historic lobby of Rutherford Place, a collection of unique residences in Stuyvesant Square. The project will serve as the final stage of the luxury condominium's extensive multi-million dollar renovation.

Renowned architectural designer Andres Escobar says he will update the lobby with "noble techniques that will enhance as well as respect the integrity of the original design. Gilded touches will highlight some of the original coffers and intricate details." Structurally engineered by John A. Roebling, celebrated for his design of the Brooklyn Bridge, and architecturally designed by Robert Henderson, the building possesses a great deal of extraordinary detail and unique charm.

Listed on the National Register of Historic Sites, the building once served as a lying-in hospital where 50% of all births in Manhattan took place. The entrance features notable works and exhibits such as an in-laid carving of the Hippocratic Oath, and a sculpted relief of Luca della Robbia's, "Cantoria."
